

Access to Optus Stadium is changing from Feb 2026

Plan ahead for changes due to Perth Park works

February 2026

WHAT'S HAPPENING

The WA Government is delivering **Perth Park**, Perth's premier entertainment and sporting precinct. The project will bring Optus Stadium, Belmont Park Racecourse, Crown Perth and the State Tennis Centre together with exciting new facilities. The precinct will be activated by a year-round calendar of community and major events, ranging from large-scale festivals to intimate local functions.

The project will feature:

- an exciting new landscaped parkland
- a multi-use building with sporting, event and function facilities
- an outdoor amphitheatre
- multi-use track for cycling and annual motorsport event; and
- a new year-round hospitality venue.

The Perth Entertainment and Sporting Precinct Alliance (PESPA) has started site establishment works in preparation for future construction activities. **During the construction period from February 2026, the park will be temporarily closed to the public.**



WHEN WILL THE PARK CLOSE?

The pedestrian path through the Park will be closed from **Monday, 16 February 2026** for the construction period.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Path users, people walking and riding from the south

Use Camfield Drive or Victoria Park Drive to travel between Optus Stadium and Crown Perth. Expect a slightly longer walking time.



Construction activities

There will be construction activity in the area from Monday to Friday, 7am to 5pm.
