Osborne Park Hospital is undergoing a major transformation as part of the New Women and Babies Hospital Project, with the expansion of maternity, gynaecology and neonatology services, birthing suites and theatres.

What's happening in October?

Establishment of the construction site compound

- Work is underway to establish the construction site compound at the corner of Limosa Close and Osborne Place, Stirling. As part of this work, steel colorbond fencing will be installed around the compound throughout October and November.
- As part of the fencing installation, there will be changes to the hospital access road off Osborne Place, between Limosa Close and Dennis Street. While access will remain open to patients and visitors parking at the A Block car park, and the hospital's waste facility, the rest of this road will be closed off. A new hospital access road, with access from Limosa Close, will be used by:
 - ambulances accessing the E Block entry
 - hospital staff, patients and visitors accessing car parks other than A Block.
- Works are ongoing to establish site offices and amenities, including earthworks and service connections.

What to expect

- Construction noise from vehicles and equipment including, but not limited to, heavy vehicles, telehandler, power tools (including rattle gun) and earthmoving equipment.
- Traffic management, including signage and personnel, to safely assist our staff, motorists, pedestrians and cyclists where required.
- Mitigation measures to minimise noise, vibration and dust impacts where feasible, include noise and vibration monitoring, and water carts and hoses for dust suppression.

Work areas

1. Steel colorbond fencing will be installed around the construction and administration site during October and November. The fencing installation will start within the hospital grounds (marked as number 1 below) and continue around the boundary of both the construction and administration sites (numbers 1-6).



2. Changes to hospital access, as shown below, will come into effect in early October.
