





New Women and Babies Hospital Project

Fiona Stanley Hospital precinct

November 2025

The Western Australian Government is building a state-of-the-art Women and Babies Hospital as part of the New Women and Babies Hospital Project. The new hospital will be built on land within the Fiona Stanley Hospital precinct. Two new multi-deck car parks will also be delivered as part of the project.

What's happening in November?

New Women and Babies Hospital

Earthworks continue this month to remove asphalt and level the ground. Starting mid-November, work will begin on the foundations for the new hospital using a method known as piling.

New vehicle entrances will be created on Jennalup Street and Fiona Wood Road to help manage access to the construction site and the childcare centre staff car park.

Potholing will take place along Robin Warren Drive and Jennalup Street throughout November. This work will be contained mostly within the verge area. Traffic management may be required at times while a vacuum truck is in use.

Colorbond fencing is being installed around the construction boundary. This will be completed over several weeks.

New multi-deck car parks

Work on the first new multi-deck car park is scheduled to begin early November, following the closure of car park 3 on 31 October.

Work crews will clear infrastructure, including boom gates and kerbing, before removing the existing car park surface and building a work platform. Piling works will then begin to enable work on supporting foundations for the new multi-deck car park.

Access to car park 2 will continue to be maintained. Some changes to the access road and Winch Way will be required to accommodate the construction area.

For the duration of construction, site office access and construction workforce parking will be located at 1 Jennalup Street.

What to expect

- General construction noise and vibration during some activities.
- Increased traffic and heavy vehicle movements in the area during construction.
- Traffic management, including signage and personnel, to safely assist construction teams, pedestrians, motorists and cyclists where required.
- Construction vehicles and equipment including, but not limited to, heavy vehicles, survey equipment, compactor and hand tools (powered and non-powered).
- Mitigation measures will be in place to minimise impacts where feasible.
- Water carts and hoses for dust suppression.















Given the proximity of some works to local roads, there may be impacts to traffic in the area.

Traffic control and signage will be in place where required to safely assist construction teams, pedestrians, motorists and cyclists. This may include redirecting traffic and stop-slow traffic controls.

Work areas

The image below shows the upcoming work areas:

- Car park 3 access to staff car park 3 will close to enable construction to start.
- Women and Babies Hospital (WBH) construction site fencing will be installed around the site.
