



# New Women and Babies Hospital Project

## Construction update - Fiona Stanley Hospital precinct

February 2026

The landmark New Women and Babies Hospital Project is set to expand services and choice for women, newborns and families, replacing the century-old King Edward Memorial Hospital.

Construction is underway on the state-of-the-art Women and Babies Hospital and the first new multi-deck car park within the Fiona Stanley Hospital precinct, Murdoch.

### What's happening on site?

#### Women and Babies Hospital

##### Piling works

Piling works are progressing on site to create the foundations for the Women and Babies Hospital. In total, approximately 420 foundation piles will be installed.

##### Jennalup Street new roundabout

Fiona Wood Road has now closed between Jennalup Street and Robin Warren Drive, and the new entry to staff car park 7 is operational. A roundabout has been constructed at the corner of Jennalup Street and Fiona Wood Road to allow local traffic using Jennalup Road to turn around and return to Murdoch Drive.

##### Footpath works – Fiona Wood Road

Work will take place in early February to extend the footpath on the eastern side of Fiona Wood Road (see *Figure 2*).

The cycle lane on the eastern side of Fiona Wood Road will be impacted during these works, however temporary fencing, signage and traffic management measures will be in place to maintain safety for all pedestrians, cyclists and road users around the work site.

The footpath extension will provide a continuous pathway along Fiona Wood Road and support safe pedestrian access to Fiona Stanley Hospital.

## Footpath works – Robin Warren Drive

Once the Fiona Wood Road footpath extension is completed, work will begin to extend the boundary of the construction site. As part of this work, the footpath on the southern side of Robin Warren Drive will close, and new site boundary fencing will be installed along this area (see *Figure 3*).

## Looking ahead

Upcoming work on site for the Women and Babies Hospital will include:

- installing fencing around the site offices for pedestrian safety.
- ongoing sheet piling, which is a construction method to support site excavation works.
- reinstating nine parking bays within Fiona Stanley Hospital staff car park 7.

## Western multi-deck car park

### Winch Way northbound closure

From 9 February, construction of the western multi-deck car park will require an extended closure of Winch Way northbound, between Jennalup Street and the car park 2 access road. This closure will remain in place for the duration of the construction of the western multi-deck car park.

Access to car parks 2 and 4 will be maintained via Robin Warren Drive and Winch Way southbound.

There will be occasional movements of large equipment to and from the site. These will be scheduled between 10pm and 11pm and will take place under traffic escort.

Site office access and dedicated construction workforce parking is located at 1 Jennalup Street for the duration of construction.

## What to expect

- General construction noise and vibration. Levels are continuously monitored to remain within safe, industry-approved limits.
- Increased traffic and heavy vehicle movements in areas where site works are taking place.
- Traffic management measures, including signage and personnel, to assist pedestrians, motorists and cyclists. This may include stop-slow traffic controls and temporary diversions.
- Construction vehicles and equipment such as survey equipment, compactors and hand tools (powered and unpowered).

Mitigation strategies will be implemented wherever feasible to minimise impacts, including water carts and hoses to suppress dust.
